After a 10 year Spinal-Tappish quest for a drummer with their band Ahab and distractions such as college and solo projects, Joe and Tony learned of Chuck's passing and decided to put together a tribute concert in his memory. Yeah, Jason played that too. The boys had so much fun that they just had to carry on. Abacus Jones was born.

In 2001, one of the originals, along with the female singer, retired. At that time, Lou Ann Shields was introduced to The Holidays audience as the new female singer. In 2002, the group recorded it's first CD, For Your Love, at West Hills Productions, produced by Radioactive Gold disc jockey, Dave Justice. In 2009, the vocal group went back to being called "The Holidays." The current vocal members of The Holidays consist of Sam Ferrella, in his 11th year with the group also manages and promotes the group. In February of 2005, The Holidays released their second CD called "Keepin' the Sound Alive". Their CD entitled "Here and Now" was released in March 2007. ## Former Chief Ralph Rich

Former Chief Ralph Rich is a 27 year veteran of the Scottsdale police force. He started the force as a patrolman on October 16, 1963. Mr. Rich would continue his role as patrolman unit to June 1973, in which time he was named chief of police. Mr. Rich would hold this title of Chief for nearly 18 years until his retirement in March of 1991. Over the years that former Chief Ralph Rich served he Investigated 10 Murders, numerous attempted homicides and several large drug busts.



When Mr. Rich was asked in an interview after he retired what he would miss most about his days as chief. He was quoted saying, "Being Chief of Police I was in a position to help people, I think that is what I will miss the most". During his 27 years on the force he received a number of awards including the J Edgar Hoover award for law enforcement in 1974 and a professional certification from the national law enforcement standards in 1979. Mr. Rich would also be awarded a silver star for bravery in 1977 and 1978 from the American law enforcement officers association. He was listed in the Who's Who in American Law enforcement in 1972 and 1980. Also, in 1982 he would receive an outstanding commendation award from the American police Hall of fame.
